Be positive - share your skills, expertise and experience with those less informed than yourself, but at the same time be prepared to learn from those younger than yourself

Keep up with the times and remember . what was accepted by the youth of yesterday is not always acceptable today.

We are a Youth Service - the young people are our Customers - if they don't like what we offer - they will go elsewhere.

POR State in Rule 3.34 Adult Training Obligations

a The holders of Warrants are required to complete satisfactorily appropriate Adult Training within three years or the Warrant will lapse.

b All adults in Warranted roles must have an up to date first aid certificate (a minimum of First Response) at the time of Warrant renewal. This should be recorded as part of the appointment review. Adults are encouraged to maintain a first aid certificate at all times.

c Section Assistants are encouraged to participate fully in Adult Training. Module 1 *Essential Information* and Module 3 *Tools for the Job (Section Leaders)* are compulsory requirements.

d Skills Instructors are encouraged to participate fully in Adult Training. Module 1 *Essential Information* is a compulsory requirement.

e Administrators and Advisers are encouraged to participate in appropriate Adult Training. Module 1 *Essential Information* is a compulsory requirement.

f All Warranted Appointments, Non-warranted Appointments, Administrators, members of Scout Fellowship and other helpers with unsupervised access to young people must complete Module 1 *Essential Information*.
